



Hampton College Primary Phase Topic Overview

Year 3 Topic: Scrumdiddlyumptious!



Art

Year 3 will use oil pastels to recreate their own fruit drawings. The children will then use inspiration from the BFG to create their own 'snozzcumber' food, consisting of one food they love and one food they hate!

Religious Education

In RE, Year 3 will be looking at Sikhism. This will include understanding who Guru Nanak is and the beliefs that Sikhs have.

Science

The children will continue looking at plants. Over this half term, we will look in more detail at the life cycle of plants, as well as how water is transported within plants.

English

Children will begin the half term by looking at instructional texts, including recipes and instructions. We will look the features of instructional texts. The children will start to plan their own recipe, before creating and following their own recipe to make a sandwich. We will then move on to look at playscripts and their features. We will create our own stage directions and use these to act out Jack and the Beanstalk.

Mathematics

After half term, Year 3 will continue to work on using the column method to add and subtract 3 digit numbers, which includes crossing over 10s and 100s with exchange. The unit will then move on to look at multiplication and division facts. The children will start by looking at equal groups and using arrays to see multiplication facts, before they start work on their times tables.

PSHE

Year 3 will be looking at antibullying. We will focus on developing friendship skills, valuing difference and who to go to when we need support.

Physical Education

For our outdoor PE sessions, Year 3 will learn how to pass and shoot using a puck in hockey. During indoor PE, Year 3 will take part in health-related exercises. This will include different circuits, as well as thinking about how exercise plays an important part of a healthy lifestyle.

Music/Languages

Year 3 will learn about some of the fundamentals of music including rhythm, timbre and volume. Music will be taught by Mr Powell from the secondary phase.

The children will continue to be taught French by Miss Hardiman.
